**ABOUT:** Students who participate in this trip should be ready to serve! The heart of missions is a willingness to serve and do whatever God leads us to do. On this trip, students will be serving doing various work projects in inner-city Indianapolis. The group will be exposed to a variety of experiences and work environments geared toward an entry-level experience. The team will work through Mission Indy, a service organization that organizes work trips within the city of Indianapolis. Students will stay together in Indy and will also have worship and discipleship elements during the trip through Mission Indy.

**WHO:** Eligible students are those who are in 10-12 grade in fall 2010, have been on a previous missions experience (weekend or summer), and who are ready to serve!

**WHAT YOU SHOULD DO:** If you are interested in this trip, take this packet and complete it as explained inside. Spend some time praying about how God can use you to serve wherever he desires as well as for your overall attitude toward service. **Turn in the application sheet** to the student ministries drop box and tell an adult volunteer or a student minister that you are interested in going. Then prepare for God to stretch you!

## Information Sheet

Trip Dates: July 25-31 Maximum Cost: \$250

### Eligibility

- Committed Christians submitted to the Lordship of Jesus Christ as evidenced by regular Bible reading, active prayer lives, the sharing of Christ with others, and active involvement in ministry at First Christian Church of Florissant
- People grades 10-12 in fall 2010
- People with servant's hearts, interested in missions work and open to God's calling in their lives.
- People who have previous Hydr8 trip experiences (either summer mission trip, Missionary Convention, or 30 Hour Famine)
- Trip acceptance will be sent when application steps have been completed

### What To Do

1. **Turn in the Application Page** into the drop box by **February 17<sup>th</sup>** (this confirms interest but not a financial commitment).

2. **Turn in Application Fee of \$50** (checks written to First Christian Church and in an envelope) to reserve your spot (by 2/17/10). Money should NOT be the only reason to not attend this trip. There are multiple ways to raise the necessary funds. Please talk to the student ministry leaders before deciding the finances are a deal breaker for you. All files/monies can be turned in via the Student Ministry drop box.

3. **Write a 1-page, single-spaced essay** describing your relationship with God, a bit about your spiritual journey, and why you want to go on this trip (due before you can be accepted). Include your personal answer to this question: "If someone in Indy asked you why you are a Christian, how would you respond?"

**NOTE \*Students who have previously done references for another Hydr8 trip can skip step 4.**

4. **Distribute 1 (one) references** (included in this packet), asking the person to complete their form, seal it (and sign the seal), and return it to you or the Student Ministry drop box. Parents are not eligible to serve as references. Possible people to use would be:

1. Someone from a church ministry staff you know
2. An adult that you have worked (served) with, either in VBS, Sunday School, nursery or other ministry area
3. An adult that you study the Bible with (small group leader, SS teacher, etc.)

\*(The total of \$250 could also be paid in full at any time. The \$50 deposit is non-refundable. If cost is paid in full, involvement in Trivia Night and other group gatherings is still required)

\*Monies will be all-inclusive, meaning every trip expense will be covered by these funds (meals, housing, travel, etc). Students may plan to bring additional funds for souvenirs.

### Fundraisers

Although the money is ultimately your responsibility, we have several fundraisers available to you. Among them are a Trivia Night – **Friday, April 16<sup>rd</sup> (required attendance)**, stock donations, personal scholarships, and possibly others. Be creative....find ways to fundraise for yourself. See this packet for more fundraising options. We do everything possible to help everyone get on this trip!! If money is the only issue, please talk to us!

## **Hydr8 Mission Trip Policies**

1. **Unconditional** obedience to senior leaders is mandatory. Any direct defiance of this authority will result in immediate termination of your mission trip experience and **you will be sent home at your own expense.**

2. Conduct is to be that expected of a Christian person -- willing to give and take and maintain the spirit of unity and harmony of the group, to extend politeness and courtesy to those with whom we come in contact -- missionaries, nationals, senior leaders, and team members. **You will be expected to have a positive attitude.**

3. No smoking or tobacco of any form, drugs or alcohol are permitted. Less addicting items, iPods and cell phones are also not permitted by students on mission trips.

4. Participation in ALL activities (before and during trip) is MANDATORY. You will be expected to give you very best at all times during work, evangelism, and all other activities.

5. Due to cultural consideration, practical jokes are not permitted.

6. You will be expected to acclimate to the culture whether you are overseas or in the U.S. This may mean eating food you are unfamiliar with or don't particularly like, or participating in foreign customs. Our policy is that you will be required to eat ALL of what is set before you unless previous notification concerning allergic reactions is given in writing by your doctor.

7. Pairing off is NOT permitted while on a mission trip, as it tends to distract from the real purpose of the trip.

8. Separation from a group is never allowed unless accompanied by a senior leader or a designated sponsor.

9. It is of utmost importance that you dress in a neat, clean, and **modest** fashion. Your appearance is important not only for the missionary's reputation, but in the way the local people will perceive you. You may have to submit to certain restrictions regarding dress (not wearing shorts), body piercing (the only acceptable piercing is small earrings for girls), and hair restrictions (hair length for the guys).

10. No phone calls or e-mails are permitted on the trip. Please leave your phone at HOME! (It has also been our experience that recruits stay more focused on their mission when contact is limited to emergencies only.) Phone calls will be restricted to emergencies only, with permission from a Senior Leader.

11. Do not exchange or give out any personal information (email, phone number, IM, online blog etc) with people we are there to serve.

12. Remember the core values we have discussed and WHY we are on this trip!

-To focus on God, develop leadership, encourage missionary workers, consider missions

-living/developing an attitude of Christ      -See a need, meet a need      -develop a servant's heart

## Missions Trivia Night – April 16<sup>th</sup>

### **Expectations:**

-Each student will be expected to be an active participant leading up to and during trivia night. While other things may surface, the general expectations are:

1. Sell at least 1 (one) table of 8 (all 8 spots). We have a large church that likes to support our students--make every effort to find people within or outside the church to attend.
2. Coordinate with Michelle Schaeffer ([michelleschaeffer1971@gmail.com](mailto:michelleschaeffer1971@gmail.com) or 524-7521) to help get donations for a silent auction. She will keep a log of who is helping and contacting her. She will need assistance with ideas, delivery of letters, and pick up of merchandise. Again, effort goes a long way.
3. Participate in the event, ready to serve (Time is to be determined, but will be in the evening. Students often are expected to come shortly after school that day). If unavoidable circumstances arise, a student's parent should fill in for them (after contacting Christian).
4. Each student must have one rotation at the Welcome Desk (Sunday mornings) to promote sign ups and sell tickets. This would mean getting to that particular place 10 minutes early and staying 15 minutes into the service. I will mark when the kids should serve and let them know. Friendliness and excitement about the trip and Trivia Night will certainly increase people's willingness to participate. Be approachable.
